Sample response: Progress does not always require greater speed. In complex work, slowing down at the right moment can prevent expensive errors and improve the final result. Skipping these checks might save a few minutes but create serious danger. The same principle applies to research, engineering, and important personal decisions. Speed is valuable when a task is familiar and reversible. When consequences are significant or information is uncertain, deliberate review is a form of progress because it increases accuracy and reduces the need to repeat work later.

Answer 98

Sample response: A former teacher influenced the way I approach difficult problems. Instead of giving immediate answers, she asked us to explain what we already knew, what information was missing, and which assumption we were making. At first, this method felt slow, but it showed me that confusion often comes from an undefined question rather than a lack of intelligence. I began using the same process in other subjects and later in professional tasks. The most important lesson I learned from her was to separate evidence from confidence. Someone can sound certain and still be

wrong, while a careful person may express uncertainty and reach a stronger conclusion. That habit has made me a more patient learner and a better collaborator.

Sample response: I would address the lack of safe pedestrian routes around schools. Many streets have faded crossings, blocked sidewalks, or traffic that moves too quickly during arrival and dismissal times. The city could then identify the most dangerous points and make targeted improvements such as raised crossings, better lighting, clearer signs, and protected sidewalks. Volunteers could support awareness campaigns, but traffic design and enforcement should be handled by professionals. Success should be measured through vehicle speeds, reported incidents, and the number of families who feel comfortable walking. A focused project around schools could later guide improvements in other parts of the community.

Sample response: A documentary about food waste changed how I understood individual responsibility. Before watching it, I assumed that most waste happened because consumers bought too much. The documentary showed that waste also occurs during farming, transportation, retail, and restaurant service because products may be rejected for appearance or damaged by poor storage. This broader view did not remove personal responsibility, but it showed me that individual habits are only one part of the solution. I became more careful about planning meals and using leftovers, while also paying attention to policies and business practices. The documentary changed my opinion because it combined data with examples from several stages of the supply chain, making a complex system visible.
