



Comparative Adjectives

We use comparative adjectives to talk about how two things are different.

My dog is stronger than your dog.

My dog is more beautiful than your dog.

Your dog is better than those two dogs.

Look!

One syllable: $long \rightarrow longer$ Two syllables + y: $busy \rightarrow busier$

Other 2+ syllables: careful → more careful / less careful

Irregular adjectives: good → better bad → worse
